Selective High School Application


Selective high schools cater for high achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level. Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 14th March 2019. The applications must be made online between 9th October 2018 and 12th November 2018. Late applications will not be accepted. You will need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address). Canteen News

Friday 19th and Monday 22nd October Lunch + Counter Sales

Please lodge all orders through Flexischools.com.au by 9.15am.

If your child is absent from school on a lunch ordering day you are able to cancel the order online prior to cut off at 9.15am or call Flexischools on 1300 361 769.

We are no longer stocking Bolognese Pasta Bake. It has been discontinued in Flexischools. As a replacement we are stocking Homestyle Beef Lasagne made by our Monday meals supplier. It is a wholefood meal and is currently available on a Friday. The cost will be \$4.50.

Term 4 heralds the sale of Sushi once again. Please see the Summer Menu for a complete update of the Menu.

REDcycle

The school will be trialling a REDcycle program. RED Group, a Melbourne-based consulting and recycling organisation, has developed and implemented the REDcycle program; a recovery initiative for post-consumer soft plastic. This program makes it easy for consumers (students) to keep plastic bags and packaging out of landfill. A box will be placed in the playground for the students to place their used plastic wrap, bags and packaging from recess and lunch. See below for more details about what can and can't be placed in the box. The teachers will be showing a short video during class time to educate the students on the program. Below is a guide to the most common items that can and can't be recycled through this program:

- Biscuit packets (outer wrapper only)
- Bread bags (without the tie)
- Bubble wrap (large sheets cut into A3 size pieces
- Cat and dog food pouches (as clean and dry as possible)
- Cellophane from bunches of flowers (cut into A3 spieces)
- Cereal box liners
- Chip and cracker packets (silver lined)
- Chocolate and snack bar wrappers
- Cling Wrap free of food residue
- Confectionery bags
- Dry pet food bags
- Fresh produce bags
- Frozen food bags
- Green bags (Polypropylene Bags)
- Ice cream wrappers
- Large sheets of plastic that furniture comes wrapped in (cut into A3 size pieces)
- Netting produce bags (any metal clips removed)
- Newspaper and magazine wrap
- Pasta bags
- Plastic Australia Post satchels
- Plastic carrier bags from all stores
- Plastic film wrap from grocery items such as nappies and toilet paper
- Plastic sachets

- Potting mix and compost bags both the plastic and woven polypropylene types (cut into A3 size pieces and free of as much product as possible)
- Rice bags both plastic and the woven type (if large, cut into A3 size pieces)
- Snap lock bags / zip lock bags
- Squeeze pouches with lid on (eg. yogurt/baby food)
- · Wine bladders clear plastic ones only



















Please make sure your plastic is dry and as empty as possible.

The Land Cookery Competition

Each year *The Land* newspaper sponsors a cookery competition open to the general public residing in NSW or the ACT. Cooking from standard recipes in *The Land* Cookery Schedule 2018/2019, each contestant has a chance to share in cash prizes and go on to represent at state level.

This year CWA Galston branch is inviting local schools to participate in Section 11, Class B of *The Land* Cookery Competition, Decorated Butter Biscuits for 12 years and under as at 31 March 2019. Four (4) biscuits to be presented, 5cm rounds decorated with 100s and 1000s. The following recipe MUST be used.

Decorated Butter Biscuits Ingredients

250g butter, at room temperature 125g (¾ cup) icing sugar mixture 1 teaspoon vanilla essence 300g (2 cups) plain flour 70g (½ cup) custard powder 2 tablespoons milk 100s & 1000s to decorate

Method

Heat oven to 180°C. Beat butter and sugar in a bowl until pale and creamy. Beat in vanilla. Add the sifted flour, custard powder and then the milk. Stir until a soft dough forms. Turn out onto a well-floured surface and bring together and shape into a disc.

Cover with plastic wrap and rest in fridge for ½ to 1 hour.

Roll out dough approximately 5mm thick and cut into rounds using a serrated 5cm scone cutter. Place on a greased tray and decorate with about ¼ tsp of 100's & 1000's sprinkles. Press in slightly with the back of a teaspoon so that they don't roll off.

Bake for approximately 12-14 minutes in oven until golden.






