Student Reports

Semester 2 reports will be sent home on Monday 16th December. Congratulations to all of our students for their efforts during the year. Thank you to our teachers, who have spent a tremendous amount of time writing reports based on a semester of quality teaching and assessment.

The Australian Government requires schools to report on student progress using an A to E scale, or equivalent wording. Our reports use wording, as follows: A = Outstanding, B = High, C = Sound, D = Basic and E = Limited. This grading scale may be different to that used on reports from your school days.

A 'Sound' (or 'C') grade indicates that a student has achieved what we expect against the particular syllabus outcomes; their skills are sound. A 'Basic' (or 'D') grade indicates that they have not quite achieved the particular syllabus outcomes, but have some skills to draw upon. Other students may be in the early stages of achieving the syllabus outcomes; they have elementary skills and would receive a 'Limited' (or 'E') grade.

Some students who have consistently demonstrated a high level of achievement against the syllabus outcomes may receive a 'High' (or 'B') grade. Students who consistently perform at a level beyond the syllabus expectations may receive an 'Outstanding' (or 'A') grade.

Don't forget to look closely at your child's effort description, as this is a key factor in his/her application and, more often than not, enjoyment of learning. If you have any questions about your child's report, you are most welcome to contact the school to arrange a time to speak to the class teacher.

Parking and School Drop-offs and Pick-ups

Please take care and be patient when dropping off and/or collecting your child from school and take note of the parking signs. A number of community members have recently expressed concern about the congestion out the front of the school, cars parking in the Kiss and Drop zone, children crossing roads without supervision, and cars double parking. Please consider the safety of all of our children.






The students have been working hard in Visual Arts. They have produced some amazing artworks!
