#### From the Principal

#### **Extreme Weather Update**

Much like the majority of Sydney, throughout the weekend our local area was inundated with strong winds and high volumes of rain. While we welcome this downpour in a time of bushfires and drought, interruptions to electricity supplies have been a challenge to our school as well as to local homes over the past few days. Many thanks to our families for their patience during this time. Our teachers have been extremely professional, ensuring lessons and routines for children remain as uninterrupted as possible.

We are also very fortunate that although we had a large tree blown down within the school grounds during the storms on the weekend, no buildings were damaged and our playground was unaffected. This meant that students were able to attend school this week with no interruptions to playground space or movement between classes. Please rest assured that our children's safety is of paramount importance and that security fencing has been erected to ensure student, staff and visitors are not at risk. We are working to have this tree removed as soon as possible.

#### **Maintenance Updates**

As is the case in many schools, holiday works in January are commonplace, and Galston PS is no different. A new septic tank has been added to the OOSH cottage, increasing capacity for the building and improving our already impressive facilities. On Thursday 6<sup>th</sup> February, the septic tanks at the back of the Library received a much-needed deep cleanout. Further litter will need to be removed from this tank in the not too distant future. Hopefully this can occur in the holiday break so there is minimal disruption to the children's playground space.

Painting – we have been informed this week that we will be receiving external painting on the OOSH building, the main admin building, as well as all four demountables. Teachers will be updated regularly about interruptions this may cause for our students in the playground (security fencing, no go zones etc). As it is external painting only, there should be minimal disruption to lessons. Please let our children know that while there will be some temporary inconveniences, the end result will be a fantastic addition to our school.

Flagpole and Flags – Work is scheduled for the flagpole to be fixed ASAP. I would also like to thank Julian Leeser (Federal Member for Parliament) for generously donating three brand new flags to our school. The Australian, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flags will be beautiful additions to our playground.

Finally, I have had the great pleasure of being invited to visit many of our classrooms over the past few days, with students and teachers proudly showing off their achievements. Kindergarten students from K-1B writing sentences with illustrations on the second day of school blew me away, and visiting 3-4F as they went through a process of research, presentation and reflection was amazing. These chances to connect with the students are a "sparkle in my day" as an educator and our teachers are very passionate about the work they undertake with each student at Galston PS. I look forward in 2020 to celebrating their moments of joy and achievement at every available opportunity. Please keep an eye out in each newsletter as different classes share this love of learning, and wherever possible, encourage your children to share the sparkle in their day with you in the car, at the dinner table or wherever the moment occurs...


Luckily the power has come back and we are looking forward to getting started with our Stage 2 programs.

# Impacts to the pressurised and vacuum wastewater system

Greater Sydney is experiencing a severe weather event with torrential rainfall, damaging winds and flash flooding. As a result, Sydney Water's operations have experienced power failures and flooding.

Power failures and flooding can cause problems with pressurised and vacuum wastewater systems. We'll help affected customers, however customers can help by using less water.

#### How does this affect you?

The pressurised and vacuum wastewater system will be affected and not working to full capacity. Customers may experience a wastewater overflow at their property because of this.

If you're connected to a pressure or vacuum system, we ask that you help by minimising your water and wastewater use. If you have a problem, contact Sydney Water on 13 20 90 and ask for assistance if required. There may be a delay in responding to you given the current demand for our limited resources.

You can help by:

- keeping showers brief
- not leaving taps running
- not using the washing machine unless you can direct the water to a plugged laundry tub (where it can be transferred by bucket onto the garden).
- not using dishwashers

We're working to restore the system and thank you for your understanding and patience.


