From the Principal

Welcome back to 5 days a week face to face learning! This week has seen the vast majority of our students transition back to normal school routines and our teachers/support staff have been thrilled to have them back. Ours is a people profession, and to be able to reconnect with the GPS children face to face has been wonderful. Throughout the one mode of learning from home, our teachers have worked extremely hard to maintain and strengthen that connection via phone, Teams and other forms of technology, but this period has also highlighted how much we miss the human element of teaching without the children in our classrooms.

As we settle back into our daily school routines, some updates for the weeks ahead...

Changes to Routine – Playground duty times/roster

Beginning this week, we will be implementing a new playground duty roster and break schedule for the remainder of the term. Classroom learning and break times will be as outlined below:

8:30am - Morning teacher on duty

8:55am to 10:55am - Learning time

10:55am to 11:05am - Recess eating time

11:05am to 11:25am - Recess play time

11:25am to 1:15pm - Learning time

1:15pm to 1:30pm - Lunch eating time

1:30pm to 2pm - Lunch play time

2pm – 3pm Learning time

As the safety and wellbeing of all students is a priority, this change will allow increased supervision in the playground, while also allowing our children to spend more time spread out on grassed areas, where they will be able to run and play at both recess and lunch.

Towards the end of the term, we will be seeking feedback from parents, students and staff regarding these changes and how we can further improve our play/supervision structures as a school learning community.

Teacher Readings

In order to connect with our children whilst in isolation, teachers at Galston PS have been videoing themselves reading a story for our students K-6 to view from home. Tree Removal

In the coming weeks, a number of large liquid amber trees behind the 3-4F classroom, K-1B classroom as well as a coral tree in the old chook pen will be professionally removed for safety reasons. Over the past 12 months, a number of visitors and staff have had slip incidents on the seed pods that these trees produce. We have also had a number of limbs down during storms, and the positioning of these trees close to classrooms poses a significant risk to classrooms, but most importantly our children.

As these trees are removed and we are eventually allowed to have visitors on site, have your shovels and wheelbarrows ready to move the mountains of mulch these trees will leave behind into our gardens as we begin our working bees!

Building maintenance updates

Over the past few weeks, our basketball backboards have been replaced, providing a vast improvement to the playing facilities on offer for our students. Mr Victor is busy repainting the hoops, and will be proudly unveiling the netting to complete the look for our basketball enthusiasts in the near future. What a difference a small change makes!





In order to maintain accessibility for all our students, we will also be completing some more work on ramps and covered walkways in the first half of June. Our main entrance to the office, as well as the pathway from the disabled carpark, past the main building and hall will be the areas where this work will be completed. This work will provide increased all weather access from the carpark to the playground, as well as increased accessibility to the main office foyer for all students and visitors to our wonderful school.

As always, safety of our students while this work is being completed will be a priority and there will be appropriate measures taken by the tradespeople on site. Many thanks in advance for yours and the children's patience while this work is carried out.

Kindergarten 2021

If you or anyone you know has children who will be enrolling in Kindergarten in 2021, we are now accepting enrolment enquiries, applications and completed enrolment forms!

As you may be aware, the Department of Education updated the enrolment policy for all NSW public schools towards the end of 2019. For those schools over their allocated cap of students, out of area applications will not be accepted, except in extraordinary circumstances.

As Galston Public School is currently over cap, priority will be given to students from our local drawing area. At this stage, we are also able to accept siblings of students who currently attend our school and live out of area. Drop off and pick up

Since beginning the phased return to school and now that we are back to 5 days a week face to face, we have been asking parents to limit the amount of time spent on site to a minimum. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of our families for respecting this request, as it greatly helps minimise risk of infection for our students and staff.



During the morning drop off and afternoon pickup, please be mindful of the need to kiss and drop from the School Road entry. We have been opening the gates at the rear entrance to the school (near KU preschool), as well as those on Arcadia Road. As there is more parking accessible on Arcadia Road, and to avoid all students entering and leaving via the same gate, I would encourage families (particularly with older students) to meet at one of these entrances if possible. This is also a far better option should you need to wait with your car in the morning or afternoon for any reason.

Thank you for your patience and kindness to other families during this period. As a school community, we can't wait to be able to welcome all our families on site again not only for learning activities, but for the valuable role of networking and socialising that makes our school so special.


