# From the Principal

#### **New Galston Public School app**

Beginning this week, our school will be transitioning to a new school app using the School Stream platform. This new GPS app will be a fantastic addition to the way we communicate with parents and care



fantastic addition to the way we communicate with parents and carers, with many immediate benefits for our learning community.

- Online absence notification
- Online real time calendar for school events
- Latest news notifications which can be tailored to your child's year level and synched to your electronic calendar
- Paperless permission slips for excursions/events
- Links to current systems (such as uniform shop, canteen + parent online payments) in one place
- Streamlining the flow and access of information to and from school

We will be beginning this process slowly, with only notifications, absent notes and other basic features such as access to school contact information and newsletters available at this point.

Over the coming weeks as we enable new features, we will keep you updated, so watch this space!

#### **Reporting and Assessment**

As our children have returned to school and begun settling into routine over the past two weeks, our thoughts now turn to reporting to our parents about student growth and achievement.

Due to the unusual circumstances of this first Semester, our reporting timeline will be slightly altered as follows:

Weeks 7 to 10 Term 2 – teachers conduct in class assessments and write their reports for each student.

Week 1 Term 3 – reports home to parents Friday 24<sup>th</sup> July.

Week 2 Term 3 – parent/teacher interviews Tuesday 28th, Wednesday 29th and Thursday 30th July.

Report format will also be simplified so that teachers can provide feedback on student learning throughout the first half of the year both in writing as well as face to face with each child's parents. Changes will be as follows:

- No general comment
- Written indicators of learning with a focus on Literacy and Maths development
- Statements of learning for other Key Learning Areas (Library, Science, PD/H/PE, History/Geography, Creative Arts)
- No effort or achievement grades for each Key Learning Area
- Commitment to learning markers to remain.

This shortened format will allow teachers to go through the assessment and reporting process in the remaining weeks of Term 2, while also speaking with confidence around student growth, success and areas for future development moving into the second half of the year. This will also allow the maximum time possible for teaching, learning, assessing and reporting throughout Semester 2. We will then resume the usual full reporting format in Semester 2.

Information regarding parent/teacher interviews will be coming home ASAP.

#### Homework

Beginning this Friday 5<sup>th</sup> June, students in Years 1-6 will resume homework. This will be handed out each Friday and collected the following Thursday. This homework will be consolidation of concepts taught in class in areas such as Maths, spelling and reading. It is also a valuable insight into your child's learning, while at the same time forming habits which will be valuable in the later high school years.

As we progress throughout the remainder of the year and in the wake of one mode of learning from home, our staff will be reflecting on many areas where we can continue to improve our practice and homework will be one of these areas.

Each class will send home the appropriate information regarding their specific requirements as we resume this part of our learning on Friday.

#### Kindergarten 2021

If you or anyone you know has children who will be enrolling in Kindergarten in 2021, we are now accepting enrolment enquiries, applications and completed enrollment forms.

As you may be aware, the Department of Education updated the enrolment policy for all NSW public schools towards the end of 2019. For those schools over their allocated cap of students, out of area applications will not be accepted, except in extraordinary circumstances.

As Galston Public School is currently over cap, priority will be given to students from our local drawing area. At this stage, we are also able to accept siblings of students who currently attend our school and live out of area.

#### Scholastic Book Club Issue 4

- Cash or cheque orders must be returned to school by **Wednesday 17**<sup>th</sup> **June** in an envelope clearly marked with Book Club, child's name and class.

#### **NSW Premier's Reading Challenge**

A reminder about changes to the NSW Premier's Reading Challenge for 2020 which have been made to help support students to participate in and complete the Challenge whilst their access to books at school and local libraries may be restricted:





#### What is happening with the Challenge in 2020?

The Challenge will continue with the same closing dates for validation of entries, and the same number of books to be read for all challenge levels. We have introduced some adjustments to support students who may be learning from home, and have reduced access to suitable reading material to complete the Challenge.

#### What changes have been made to the PRC rules for 2020?

The main changes to the Challenge rules are as follows:

- Students on all Challenge levels are able to read 10 choice books an increase from five. Please see below about adding these additional choice books to a student reading record.
- Students on all Challenge levels will be able to include books on their reading records that they read collaboratively as a class, in person or online with their teacher or at home with their parents/carers.
- Students who complete the Challenge in 2020 will be able to count this towards cumulative awards.
- Students who do not participate in the Challenge in 2020 will not be disadvantaged in the receipt of cumulative awards.

#### How do students add these bonus choice books to their reading records?

Students will need to add their first 5 choice books the same way they always have for the Challenge. Their bonus choice books will need to be entered using the following PRC numbers:



#### News From 1-2M


1-2M students are excited to be back in class after a long period of remote learning!

In English, we are learning to write persuasive texts using the OREO Technique. Students are beginning to incorporate rhetorical questions and use persuasive language to convince the reader. There have been many engaging discussions and points of view on a variety of topics, particularly 'why children should/should not eat junk food'.

We have read Lauren Child's persuasive book, *I Will Never Not Ever Eat A Tomato*. In the story, Charlie persuades his little sister Lola to eat all the food she doesn't like by giving them creative names. For Visual Arts, students were then given the task of drawing vegetables using oil pastels and giving them interesting names. We were all persuaded to eat the 'Nats' and 'Snozcumbers'.
