## From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

Well, what a term this has been! We began the term with around 20 students in attendance each day, with a balancing act between working from home (for both students and parents!) four days a week and working from school one day a week. By Week 5, we had moved through Phase 1 and were back to 5 days a week learning in classrooms. As the term has progressed, we have seen gradual progressions back to normality (such as assemblies, band, performance groups etc), all underpinned by extra cleaning services to ensure the ongoing safety of our students.

For these gradual steps back to more face to face interaction, we are truly grateful. Ours is a people profession, and I believe that this community connection is particularly important in a community like Galston. While we found innovative ways to connect during lockdown, nothing beats the human connection evident in our classrooms each day.

As we move into the latter part of 2020, we enter the next phase of planning for our learning community. Recently, the Department has announced new professional learning and tools to help facilitate this planning process, and we look forward to getting feedback and ideas on future directions for our school from our staff, students and community throughout Semester 2 as we plan for the future. This new phase will take us through the next four years (2021 - 2024) with a strong focus on the development of Literacy and Numeracy Skills, wellbeing and attendance for all students.

If Semester 1 2020 has taught us anything, it is that we have much to be grateful for in the people surrounding us every day. Our families, our teachers and support staff, our children and our friends. Above all, the relationships we share at Galston PS are our bond and motivation to build a better future each day for the children we serve.

Thank you everyone for your work, kindness to one another and learning this Semester. Please enjoy a restful, well-earned break, and we look forward to continuing our learning journey in Semester 2...

#### WHS Drills – Lockdown and Evacuation

Each term, students and staff complete Lockdown and Evacuation drills in preparation for the rare chance that a real emergency occurs. Last week, teachers talked students through both of these procedures and finished up with a run through of the different sirens they will hear should we require them in an emergency. This Friday (3<sup>rd</sup> July), all classes will complete a lockdown drill within their classrooms. Families may wish to speak with their children about these drills, emphasising that they are a practice and not the real thing.

With student and staff safety our main priority, these drills are extremely important in making sure we are all aware of our different roles should the need arise.
