In Semester 2 this year, our Stage 3 students are actively engaged in Project Based Learning. In all of our learning K-6 at GPS, we are striving to embed the general capabilities of the Australian Curriculum.



In 2020, however, Project Based Learning is providing our Stage 3 students the opportunity to develop these capabilities even further as they immerse themselves in designing 3 garden spaces in underdeveloped areas of our school. This type of learning provides our students with a sense of ownership and voice, building their general capabilities in real and practical settings.

Today it was my great pleasure to visit 5-6G and observe how our children had used Minecraft to research and design their space. They articulately described their vision/ideas and we cannot wait to share this learning with you, our community, as Term 4 progresses. Literally, watch this space for not only examples of this fantastic use of technology, but also for updates on how our senior students will transform some previously underutilised areas of our playground. We are extremely proud of their collaboration, creative and critical thinking to this point.

Mrs Muscat and our Stage 3 teachers are working extremely diligently on this learning journey and are very capably supported by Mr Finch in the technology space. Along the way, they have engaged with experts and mentors from other schools, and it is terrific to see not only our high levels of student engagement with Project Based Learning, but the teachers pushing their own professional learning boundaries to provide rich experiences for our children.

Year 6 Mini Fete Raffle



Uniform Shop


