From the Principal

COVID update – further information

Now that school routines have been established for the first few weeks of the year, we have received updated guidance from the Department of Education and NSW Health that parents (including K-2) are not allowed on school sites, except for limited purposes. While we understand that restrictions have eased in many parts of the community, all NSW DoE schools must follow guidelines issued. We have been very fortunate to have time over the first few weeks to settle our youngest students (K-2) into their morning and afternoon routines, and we hope that as restrictions ease further that we will be able to return to on site morning and afternoon pickup as the year progresses.

As Term 1 continues and until further updates become available, some clarification on planned school activities:

- Parent/carer can attend a school's administration building or other defined location for the purpose of picking up or dropping off a child with disability.
- Uniform shop and canteen are able to still operate as normal.
- Kindergarten welcome afternoon tea and second-hand uniform sale can proceed as planned this Thursday afternoon. Outdoor gatherings of up to 50 people can still occur with appropriate social distancing.
- Parent volunteers can attend to support student learning (eg reading groups). This will commence in the coming
 weeks and parents will need to sign in at the office prior to entering classrooms.
- Parents of children being inducted at the SRC assembly can attend with outdoor seating. Invitations were sent out late last week.
- SRE and SEE can continue as normal, with volunteers signing in at the office.
- Other activities such as Grandparents Day, Easter Hat Parade etc will be reviewed closer to the date and in accordance with guidelines at the time.
- Sports events (eg cross country, AFL Clinics etc) can proceed as planned.
- Drum Group, Band and Dance Group are able to proceed as planned. Choir remains on hold due to restrictions on singing and chanting.
- Visitors (ie tradespeople, external providers etc) are able to attend the site with appropriate sign in procedures.
- P&C meetings can go ahead after hours. Last year it was decided to hold half of these meetings at school and in person, with the other half to be via Zoom. This allows more flexibility for families to attend from home. Our next meeting will be via Zoom on Tuesday 9th March.
- Working Bee planned for Week 8 (18th March) can proceed as planned.
- Our office will remain open for parents who need to attend in person if required.

All parents K-6 will be able to pick up and drop off from the gates of our three entry/exit points in School Road, Arcadia Road as well as near the KU preschool. Kindergarten teachers will continue to walk children over to the School Road gates each afternoon to facilitate a smooth pickup.

If all parents/carers could take the time to speak with their children about pick up and drop off arrangements, that would be greatly appreciated. It is also vitally important that parents are punctual to meet their child at the arranged gate each afternoon and we thank you in advance for this organisation.

We thank you for your patience and understanding and as always, we will keep you updated should the guidelines change.

Working Bee Week 8

It's official! Take out your diary and set aside the date: after school on Thursday 18th March (Week 8) our P&C, led by Belinda Crofts, will be hosting our first working bee for 2021. This will be an opportunity to begin tidying some of the spaces which are in need of a little TLC. We look forward to welcoming any parents, students or family members who are able to volunteer a few hours in the interests of brightening up our beautiful grounds. This will also be a time to share ideas and plan for future working bees in the many playground areas, as well as to network as a community. A BBQ will be organised at the end of the day for all of our volunteers.

Data Talks Kick off!

This week, our teachers have engaged in their first round of Data Talks. Data Talks are based on the work of Lyn Sharratt, and allow our teachers time to collaboratively analyse specific student data.

These Data Talk sessions are led by Mrs Muscat as our school's Instructional Leader and involve teachers collaborating over attendance data, as well as specific data targeting reading and number acquisition K-6. While this data is readily available, providing time to analyse, group and plan is invaluable to then impacting teaching and learning back in classrooms. Mrs Muscat will spend time from 9am-11am each morning session between each 5 weekly check in, team-teaching with teachers based on the previous data talk and targeting specific groups of students as they complete their reading session. In this way, intervention is daily and ongoing for the entire school year. This powerful professional learning will impact not only on our teachers' practice, but also allows us to regularly check in on our student progress.



Maths Support - Newman's Prompts

As one of the starting points to supporting student learning in Mathematics this year, Mrs Cansdale will begin working with all students in Year 5 on Newman's Error Analysis.

In the 1970s, Australian educator Dr Ann Newman identified 5 basic steps students must work through in order to solve written word problems. Newman suggested 5 prompts to help guide students through this problem-solving process:

- 1. Reading Read the question to me
- 2. Comprehension What is the question asking you to do?
- 3. Transformation How are you going to work out the answer?
- 4. Processing Show me how you are going to find the answer
- 5. Encoding Write down your answer

All students in Year 5 will be working in small groups with Mrs Cansdale to apply this process to a range of word-based problems to strengthen their problem-solving skills. All teachers in Years 2-6 will also be undertaking professional learning in these prompts over the coming weeks to be implemented in class. Often, our children are able to do the mathematics, and Newman's Prompts are a way of breaking down the literacy challenges these problems can present.

Acknowledgement of Country

On Monday 22nd February, our Indigenous students in Years 3-6, along with the school leaders and parents worked collaboratively to create an Acknowledgement of Country unique to Galston Public School. As the year progresses, we will seek input from our Indigenous students and their families in Years K-2, as well as our local Aboriginal Education Consultative Group (AECG) as we edit and refine this work. Rondelle Ryan (Aboriginal Education Officer) was instrumental in this process, providing leadership and guidance as the children and adults combined their ideas.

Meaningful recognition of the purpose of an Acknowledgement of Country, as well as our community's Indigenous heritage/links, is an important part of our children's education, and it was with great pleasure that we began this work this week.




When we get 3 Excellence Awards we receive a Badge



News From KM




Walston is such a good dog – he waits for us to come to school each day and can't wait to help us hang up our bags and take out our things ready for learning. Thanks Walston!


