

Maintenance Works Term 2

Term 2 (and possibly part of Term 3!) is shaping up to be extremely busy from a maintenance and assets perspective at our school. While there will be some inconvenience over the coming weeks and months, we are set to see some excellent improvements for the students of Galston Public School.

- Administration building scaffolding has now been erected and works are set to commence on re-roofing our heritage-listed administration building. This will give a beautiful building a much-needed facelift, with stormwater drainage also being upgraded as part of this work.
- Tiered Learning Space the old technology room adjacent to the Library is being used as a temporary staffroom while our administration building is being restored. Once complete, this tiered learning space will have the steps removed and be recarpeted and painted. This will allow us to create a learning space more conducive to Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) where children will be able to create, explore and discover.
- Computer Lab (cottage) old computers in our computer lab will be distributed into classroom spaces where
 they will receive more use in their retirement years! The current cabling infrastructure will be removed and the
 cottage will be recarpeted and painted. This will then create a multi-purpose learning space for our students
 and teachers to use moving forward.
- Toilet upgrade under the Metro Renewal Scheme (designed to stimulate the economy) the Department of Education is jointly funding a major upgrade to our student toilet facilities. Tiling, painting, toilets, partitions, doors, urinals, soap dispensers and taps/bubblers will all be part of these works. As I am sure you will appreciate, this will be a major bonus for our students each and every day at school. In addition to this refurbishment, we will also be having the existing toilet at the end of Mrs Hitchcock's classroom converted into a disabled toilet space.

- New Playground Space over a weekend late last term, we had some gum trees drop limbs. In the interests of student safety, these trees will be removed in the near future. Rather than go to waste, however, our school will be partnering with Architects of Arcadia, a playground design company, who will work with students, staff and community to design and construct a natural playground space using natural products such as timber (ie gum trees!), stone, rope and sand. This will be a fantastic addition to our playground space which all of our students will be able to enjoy in both class and break times.
- OOSH upgrades our Out of School Hours Care (OOSH) is a wonderful asset to our school, allowing many of
 our families the flexibility to work their required hours, safe in the knowledge that their children are being well
 cared for by Shanna and her team of carers. Over the coming weeks, our OOSH building will be repainted
 and new vinyl laid throughout. This will also be a fabulous addition for many of our students who utilise this
 facility both during the term and through its vacation care programs.

Cross Country

Last Friday 30th April, our students, teachers and families enjoyed some fabulous autumn weather as we held our yearly Cross Country Carnival. A huge congratulations to all of our race winners and place getters, with some fierce competition amongst the age groups. Equally impressive was the way in which our students participated, enjoying the opportunity to exercise and feel the achievement of simply running the distance. The sportsmanship displayed was impressive as our house leaders and all students cheered each other on.



Part of our Strategic Improvement Plan for the next 3 years is Wellbeing, with a particular focus on physical activity.

As we move forward, this positive link between exercise and the impact on student wellbeing will continue to be at the core of not only special events such as Cross Country, but increasingly integrated into our everyday teaching and learning programs.

Particular thanks to Mrs Cansdale and Mrs Hitchcock for their organisation of the Cross Country event, as well as Mrs Ferris and her canteen team for organising many, many lunch orders on the day.

We look forward to hearing how our students fare as they represent Galston PS at the Zone Cross Country Carnival later this term.



National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) Online Testing

Between the dates of Monday 11th and Friday 22nd May, students in Years 3 and 5 will participate in NAPLAN Online. Students do not need to be computer experts to take the NAPLAN test online. Making sure students have computer skills is part of our school curriculum, and our teachers will ensure your child is familiar with the online format.

Children will complete assessments in Reading/Comprehension, Spelling, Grammar, Writing and Numeracy. NAPLAN is a point-in-time assessment that allows parents to see how their child is progressing in literacy and numeracy against the national standard and compared with their peers throughout Australia. At the classroom level, NAPLAN provides additional information to support teachers' professional judgement about student progress.

Kindergarten 2022

If you or anyone you know has children who will be enrolling in Kindergarten in 2022, we are now accepting enrolment enquiries, applications and completed enrolment forms!

As you may be aware, the Department of Education updated the enrolment policy for all NSW public schools towards the end of 2019. For those schools over their allocated cap of students, out of area applications will not be accepted, except in extraordinary circumstances. Since Galston Public School is currently over cap, priority will be given to students from our local drawing area. At this stage, we are also able to accept siblings of students who currently attend our school and live out of area.

- **Parent orders** (e.g. a present for child) mark the envelope as a parent order and include your phone number.



In History, we have been learning about how people lived in the past. We really wonder how people coped without washing machines, microwaves, fridges and, most importantly, computers. Children Back Then didn't even know what an iPad is...!

Our class went on an expedition around the school to discover artefacts and we discovered so many – even our old school bell!







In Maths, we have been learning to solve subtraction number problems using various strategies including stating the place value of two-digit and three-digit numbers. We've also been learning how to read o'clock, half-past, quarter-past and quarter-to time on analog and digital clocks.











Our class uses Galston Gotchas and Dojos to reward positive behaviour. A few of us have received the Gotcha Excellence Award and it will not be long before others catch up! Students earn Dojo points based on their classroom conduct, eg perseverance, being helpful, completing work on time, taking risks, being polite etc. At the end of the day, students who have earned the maximum Dojo points can choose an activity of their choice for 5 minutes eg. sitting on the teacher's chair, going on the iPad, drawing, playing with the orange squishy ball, etc.

Our class assembly item is coming up in Week 7 and we're looking forward to our performance.




Uniform Shop

Work to upgrade school zone signs across New South Wales. Start of Work on Arcadia Road, Galston week commencing 3 May 2021

The NSW Government is funding an upgrade to school zone signs, at Galston Public School as part of the Transport for NSW School Zone Flashing Lights program to improve the safety for students in the area.

Transport for NSW is upgrading school zone signs at 70 schools across the state. This includes removing obsolete equipment and upgrading the sites.

Transport for NSW currently manage over 5800 school zones flashing signs that keep school children safe across NSW. Installing flashing lights signage in school zones has led to improved driver awareness of driving at a lower speed to ensure the safety of children and people coming and going from the school area.

Our work schedule

We will be on site for one or two shifts, week commencing 3 May 2021

Our work hours will be between 7am and 6pm from Monday to Friday, Saturday 8am to 1pm, weather permitting.
